

Birth Injury


Q. When does birth injury occur?

A. Before, during or after childbirth. While normal complications may emerge during childbirth, it is up to the healthcare provider (obstetrician, family practitioner, anesthesiologist, midwife, or nurse) to respond to complications that may arise.

Types of errors include:

- **1** Failure to respond to fetal distress
- 2. Failure to respond to umbilical cord compression or entrapment
- **3** Misuse of forceps or a vacuum extractor during delivery
- **4.** Delayed C-section
- 5. Failure to respond appropriately to bleeding
- 6. Failure to anticipate birth complications with a larger baby
- 7. Failure to anticipate maternal health complications
- 8. Inappropriate administration of birth induction drugs
